

The profit from the evening was \$3,738.58.



## ECUMENICAL PRIORITIES AFTER 50 YEARS OF ARCIC



ARCIC (the Anglican-Roman Catholic International Commission) was established in 1967 and has just published five agreed statements with commentaries from ARCIC II (1983–2005). The lecture will review their significance in the light of ecumenical progress since Vatican II and propose future priorities for theology, dialogue, church leadership and local pastoral activity.

Denis Edwards is a Professorial Fellow in Theology at Australian Catholic University and a priest of the Archdiocese of Adelaide. He has served on the Roman

Catholic dialogues with both the Anglican Church in Australia and the Lutheran Church of Australia and has conducted research in the Theology of Receptive Ecumenism.




