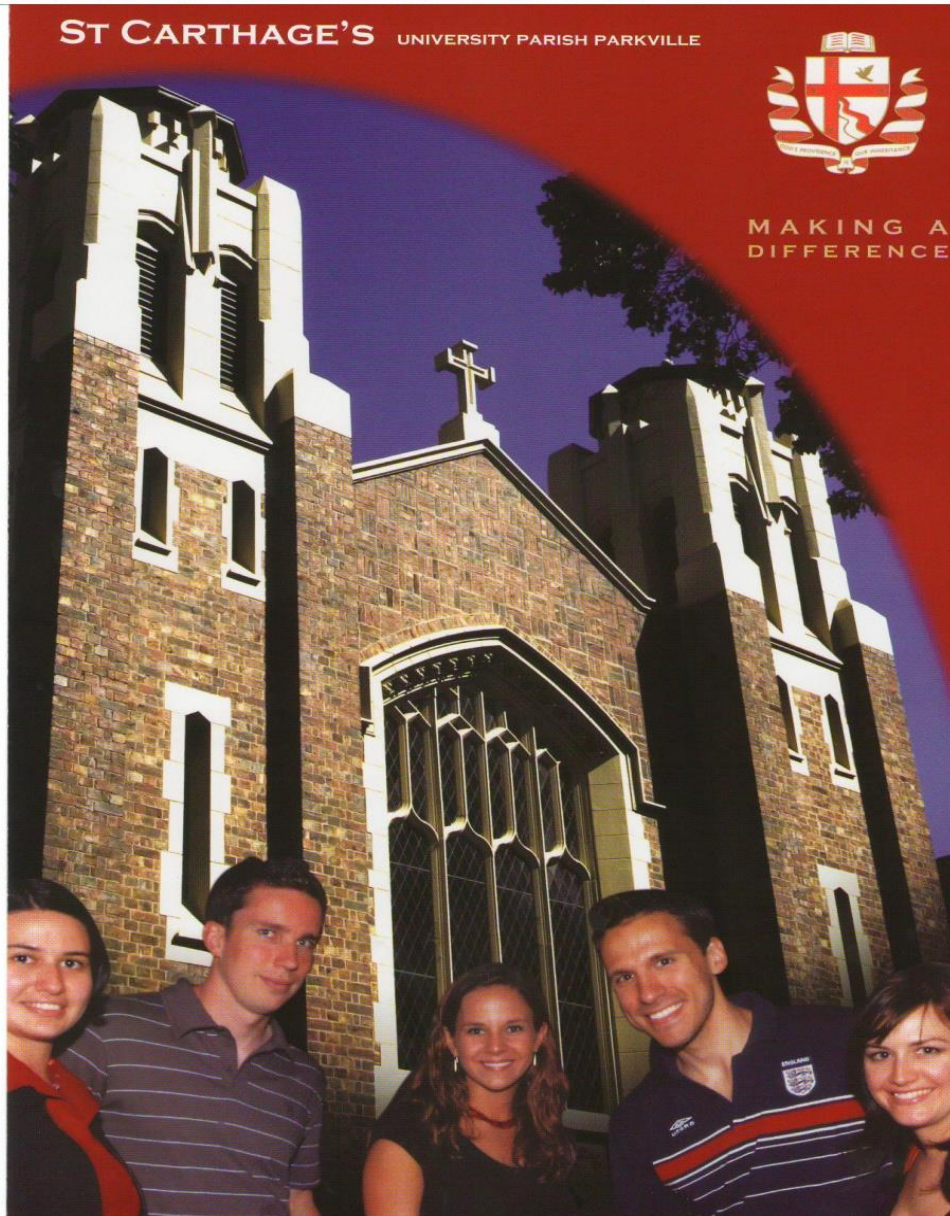

The Royal Commission: What happens now?

Francis has worked in government and private practice and has held positions as secretary-general of the Australian Medical Association, chief executive of Catholic Health Australia and senior adviser to the Minister for Health in Western Australia. He is committed to equity and justice and has been highly successful in bringing a social conscience to the political debate on health and aged care issues. Francis has served as a consultant to the Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Health Care Workers at the Vatican and is an Adjunct Professor at the Australian Catholic University in recognition of his work in public policy advocacy. He is now the Chief Executive Officer of the Truth, Justice and Healing Council, established in 2013 by Catholic Religious Australia and the Australian Catholic Bishops. This Council has the role of coordinating the Church's engagement with the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse

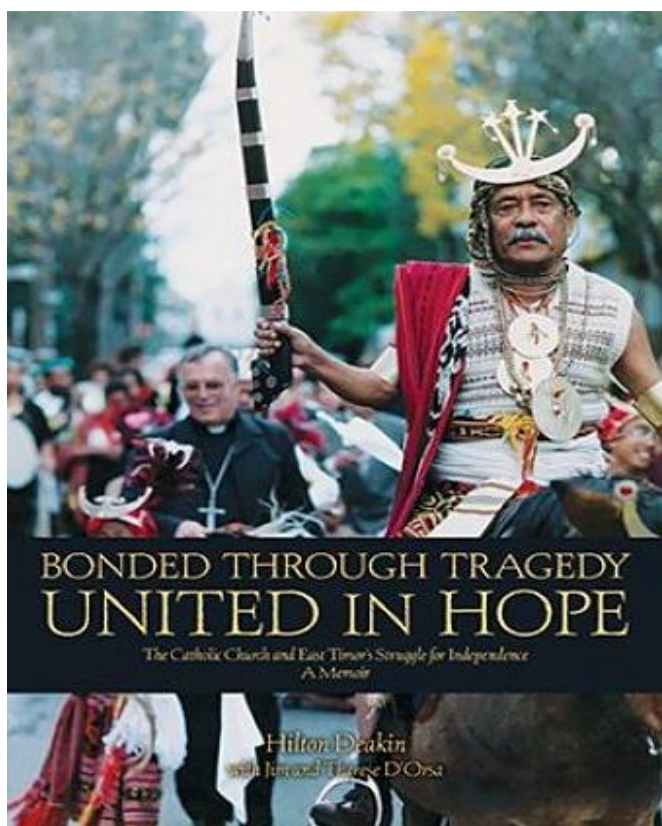

This is the third time the Students of the University have requested to use our Church for recitals.

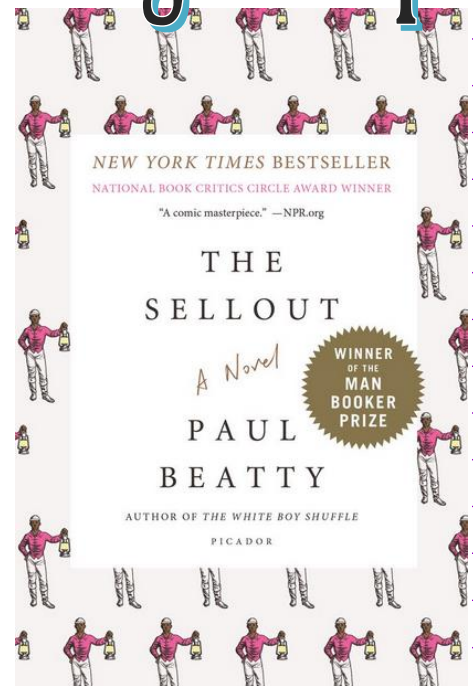
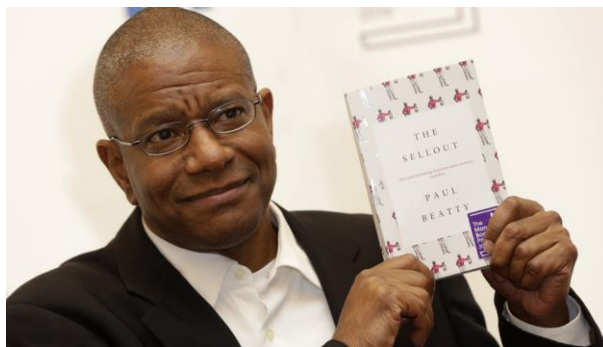
