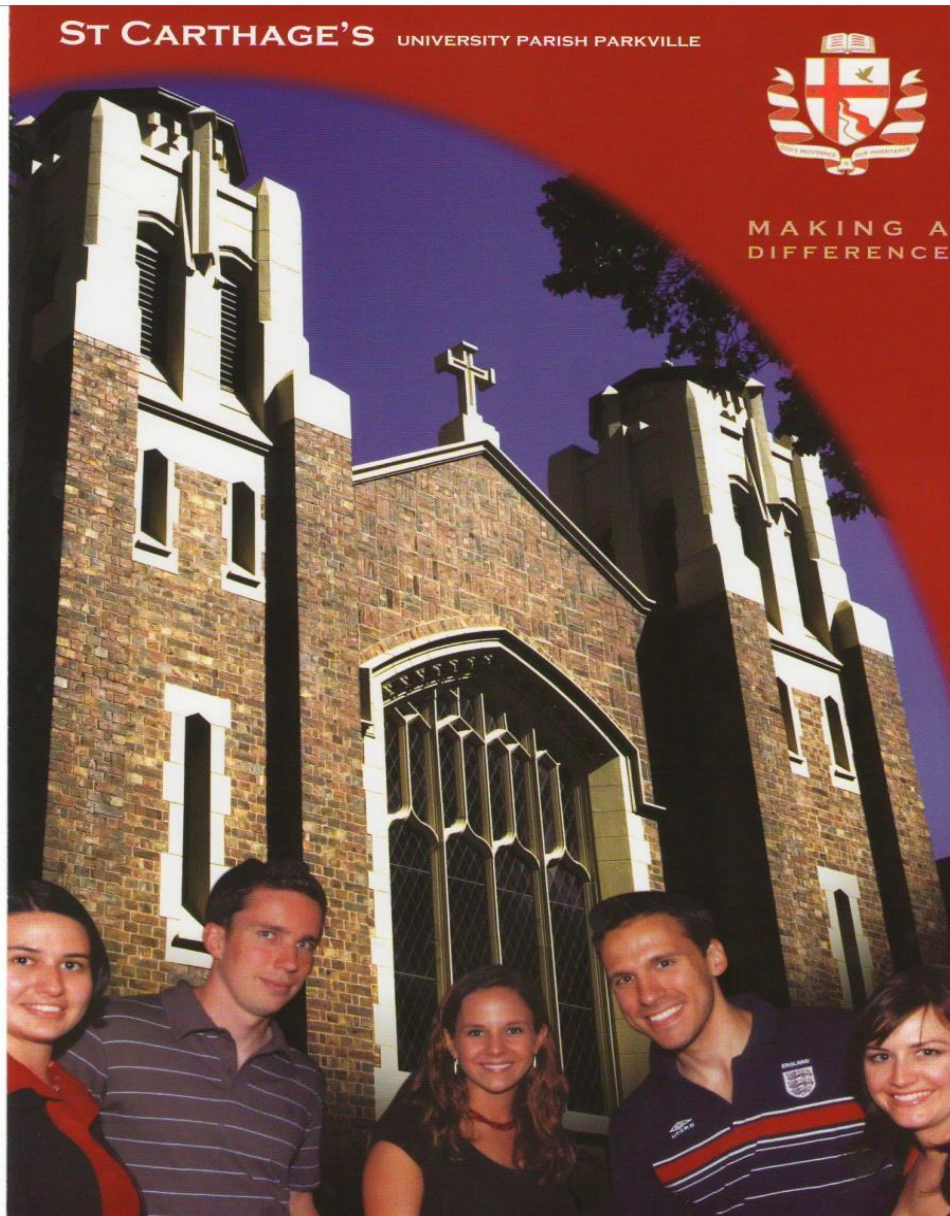

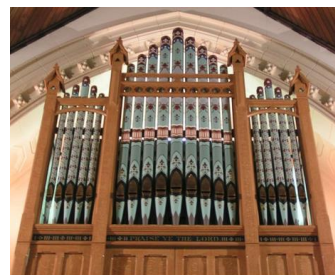


Music at St Carthage's

➔ Elizabeth Anderson will play harpsichord at the 5pm Student Mass.

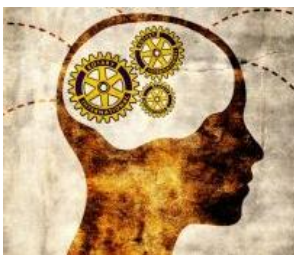

The Royal Commission: Being Catholic in Public after all that has gone on

Fr Frank Brennan SJ, AO is an eminent advocate for justice on many fronts, including for reform of many aspects of practice within the Catholic Church.

In this presentation, he will be reflecting not so much on the findings of the Royal Commission into Institutional Child Abuse, or on the effect on victims. Instead, he will speak on the effect on the Catholic faithful at large – those who remain in the Church in the face of the shame and the sense of betrayal that rest with them.

What are the different reactions among them? Has the willingness of many even to admit membership of the Church suffered a mortal blow? Do they carry on as usual, but only in private? Will the public listen at all now to what the Church has to say on today's issues?

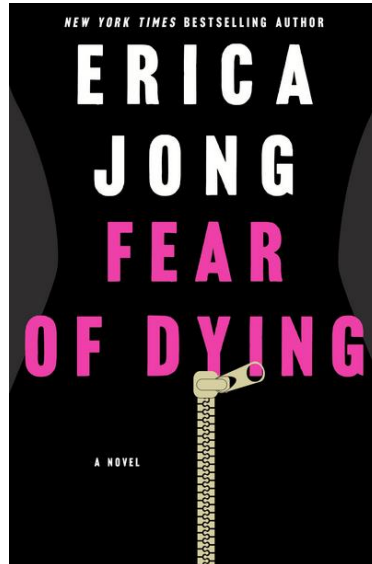

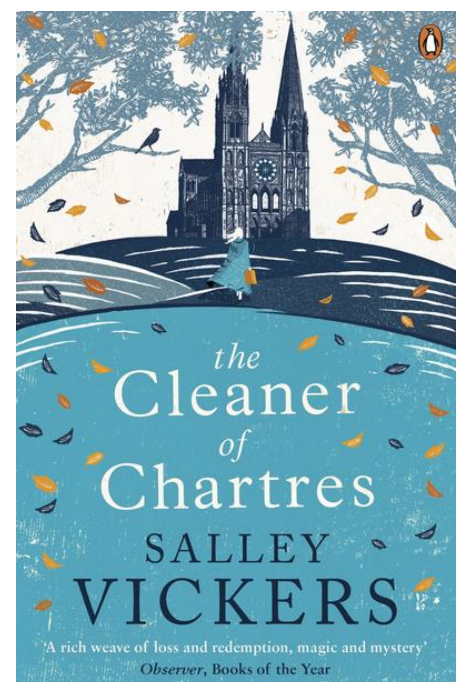
