

Annual Blessing of the Animal


Saturday, 28th October at 2.00pm

We will resume the series next March 2018. A sincere thanks to our Committee for inviting superb speakers and facilitating the evening.




Grandmothers against Detention of Refugee Children

Fr Frank Brennan SJ AO



Jesuit priest Fr Frank Brennan has been a long-time advocate for human rights and social justice in Australia. He currently holds the position of Chief Executive Officer of Catholic Social Services Australia. Frank is an adjunct professor at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture. He is also the superior of the Jesuit community at Xavier House in Canberra. He is, and always has been amplifying the voice of conscience, especially the voice of those who are marginalised.
