

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Steering Group met recently to discuss distribution to local social justice activities of more than \$5000 raised through the Trivia Night and raffle. That done, the Steering Group was quietly put to sleep. With Fr Michael's approval it has morphed into a Parish Pastoral Council (PPC), a proposal strongly supported in the current survey. It has a brief to develop a draft Pastoral Plan for discussion and hopefully, eventual adoption by the Parish. The planning work will be much assisted by the survey, which has brought in many thoughtful observations, suggestions and opinions, to be reported later. The survey will remain open for a few more weeks - pick up a copy at the church or better, complete it online (there is a link in the weekly eBulletin).

Notes on our quarterly financial report

- Our contributions to the Planned Giving Program are holding very well, given this is into the final stages of the three-year commitment. We are only around \$300 below the projected level of contributions. Deceased contributors, people moving to other parishes together with requests to decrease regular contribution due to changed circumstances lead to this shortfall.
- The budget column indicates the projected amount that is expected in contributions and expenditure by the end of the year.
- The Parish Finance Committee is engaged in plans for renewed toilet facilities at the rear of the Church. At the moment plans are being prepared for local government authorities. The plans include a safer gradation to toilet access with the assistance of helpful handrails on respective paths.
- The finance committee has been granted approval to take out a loan of around \$60,000 from the Diocesan Maintenance fund. Other smaller projects include recarpeting the sacristy and purchasing a mobile storage stand for our hymn books.




