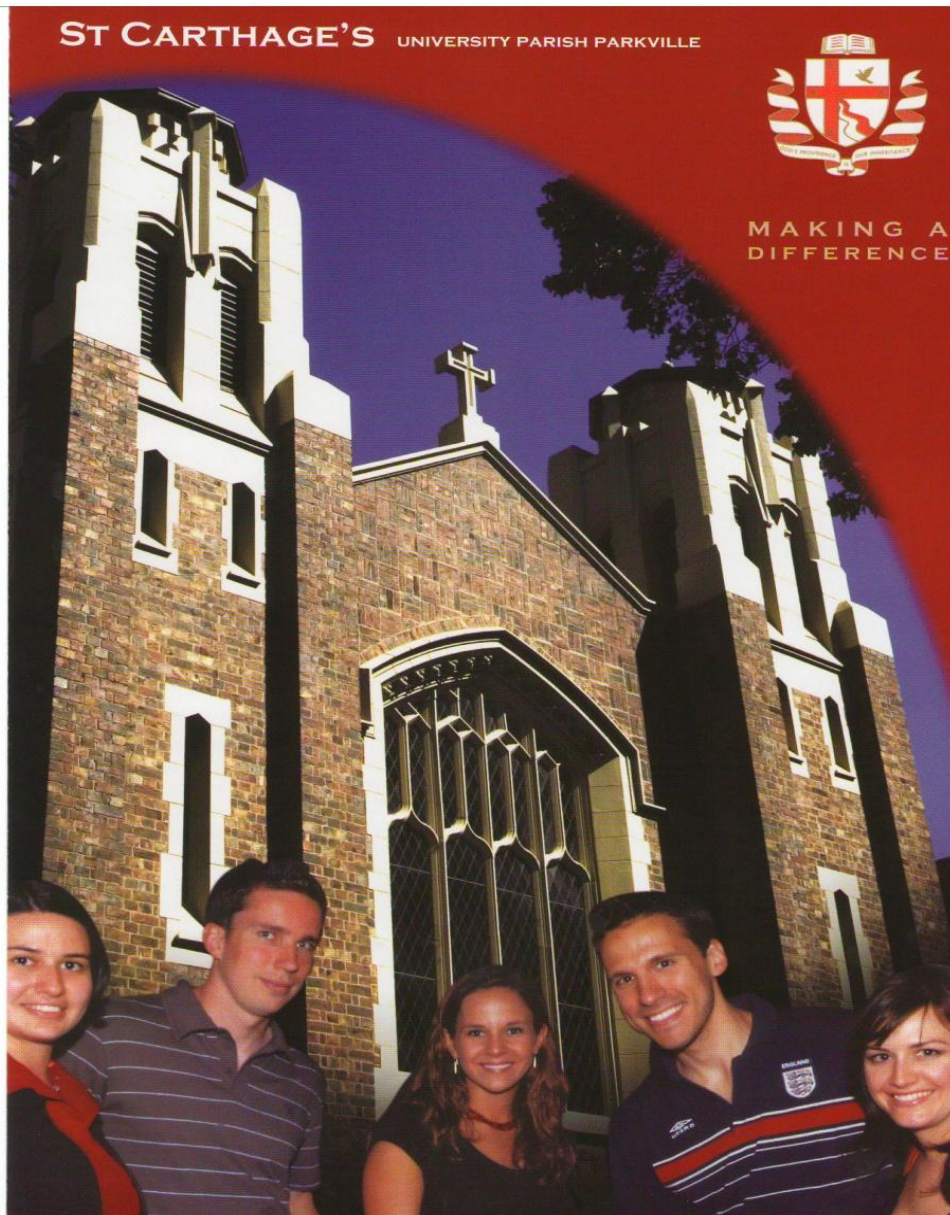

GENDER ISSUES EXPLORED

It seems to be becoming more common now to hear that we are in the midst of a "Gender Revolution". What does this mean, and what are its implications for our experience and acceptance of the sexuality of others?

What is meant by gender dysphoria, how common is it, and what are the likely implications of it for a person's mental health? Is it a recent phenomenon, or has it only recently been given attention? What are the ethical, psychological and medical Issues Involved in gender re-assignment?



Associate Professor Campbell Paul, our presenter, is a consultant infant and child psychiatrist at Melbourne Royal Children's Hospital, and works with its gender service group.

He appeared on the ABC's Australian Story last year when the court gave permission to Georgie Stone to change her gender.

Scholarships for Theological Study

Parishioners of St Carthage's might be interested in the following opportunity. Following the recent closure of the United Faculty of Theology, Pilgrim Theological College, located on College Crescent and operated by the Uniting Church in Australia, has committed to keeping alive the distinctive vision of ecumenical theological education for which the UFT was renowned. Together with its own Uniting Church, Lutheran, Baptist and Catholic lecturers, Pilgrim has embraced members of the former Jesuit Theological College faculty, to offer theological degrees within the University of Divinity. **To mark the 40th anniversary of the Uniting Church in Australia, Pilgrim is offering 40 scholarships to cover 75% of the University of Divinity fees in 2017, for students enrolling in the Graduate Certificate of Theology or the Graduate Diploma of Theology at Pilgrim Theological College. The balance of fees remaining after the scholarship is about \$572. (For eligible students, this can be covered by FEE-HELP, see www.studyassist.gov.au). Enrolment will include access to the world-class resources of the Dalton-McCaughey Library, co-owned by the UCA and the Society of Jesus.**

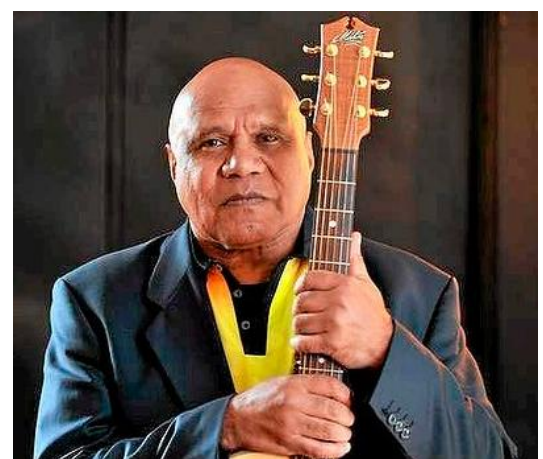

ECOLOGY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Laudato Sí, GM crops & agroecology in Brazil.

1:30pm, Sunday 5th March 2017

St Ambrose Hall, 3 Dawson St, Brunswick

Hugh Lacey, graduate of Melbourne University, philosopher of science, has worked in Brazil with university and rural communities, examining the science, ethics and presuppositions of competing agricultural approaches. He will pay special attention to agroecology—an alternative to genetically modified organism-intensive agriculture—that reflects the values of food sovereignty, social justice and popular participation, and represents an important part of efforts to deal with the current intertwined ecological and social crises. He will discuss these issues in the perspective of *Laudato Sí*, especially of its Chapter 3, "The human roots of the ecological crisis."

Hugh's talk will be followed by responses from Anne Elvey and Simon Reeves.

There will then be music and a break for afternoon tea, followed by general discussion.

Dr Anne Elvey is a poet and theologian, and edits journals on those fields. She is based at Monash University and University of Divinity, Melbourne. Her recent Published works include (as co-editor) *Climate change- Cultural change*.

Simon Reeves works in communities experiencing disadvantage—currently with Urban Seed Norlane, a faith based community development organization centering around food, hospitality, community gardens and neighbourhoods. Simon is married to Kaylene and has three young children. He also works for Pace e Bene Australia as trainer in nonviolence.
