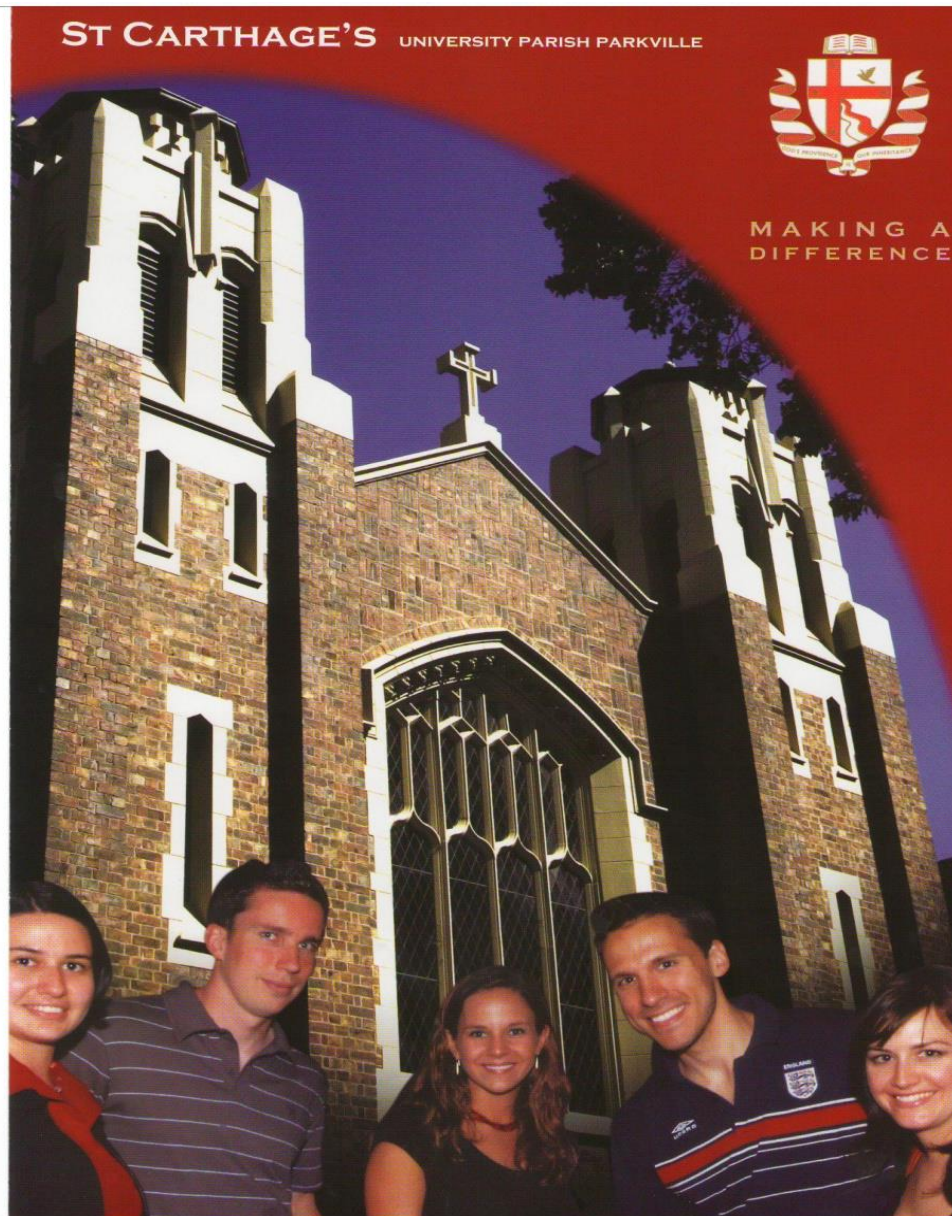

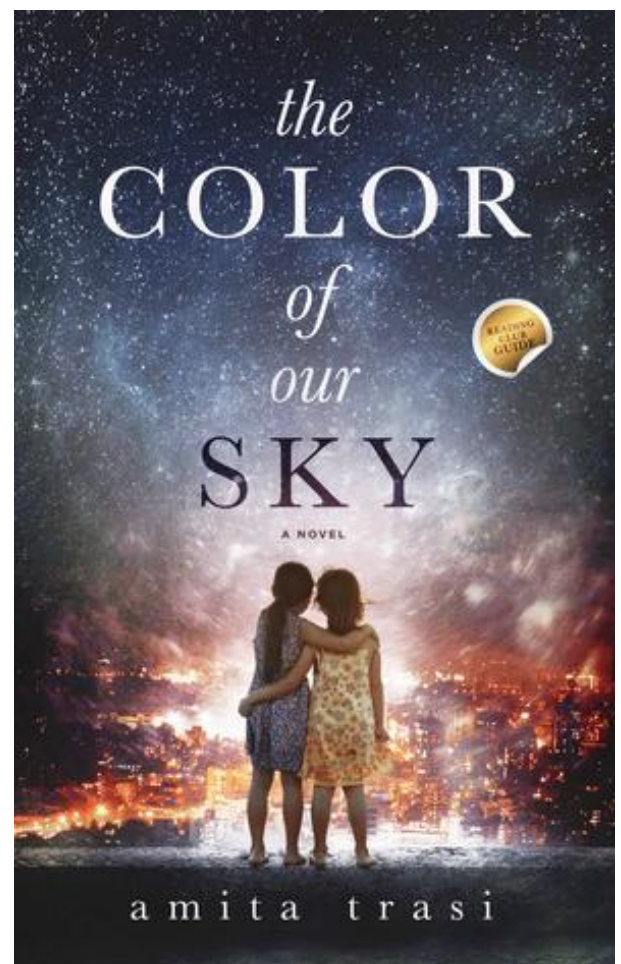
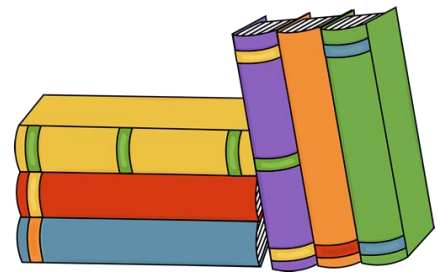

PUBLIC LECTURE
Trading the Word:
Gutenberg Bibles and English Libraries
by **Shane Carmody**

In this lecture Shane Carmody will tell the stories of the seven Gutenberg Bibles in English Libraries and some that got away. The first book printed with moveable type in Europe, Gutenberg's bible was a major turning point from the medieval to the modern world, and brought a technology that spread knowledge, controversy, and ultimately revolution. The stories of these bibles reflect this cultural shift as well as the rise of book collecting and the trade which supports it.
