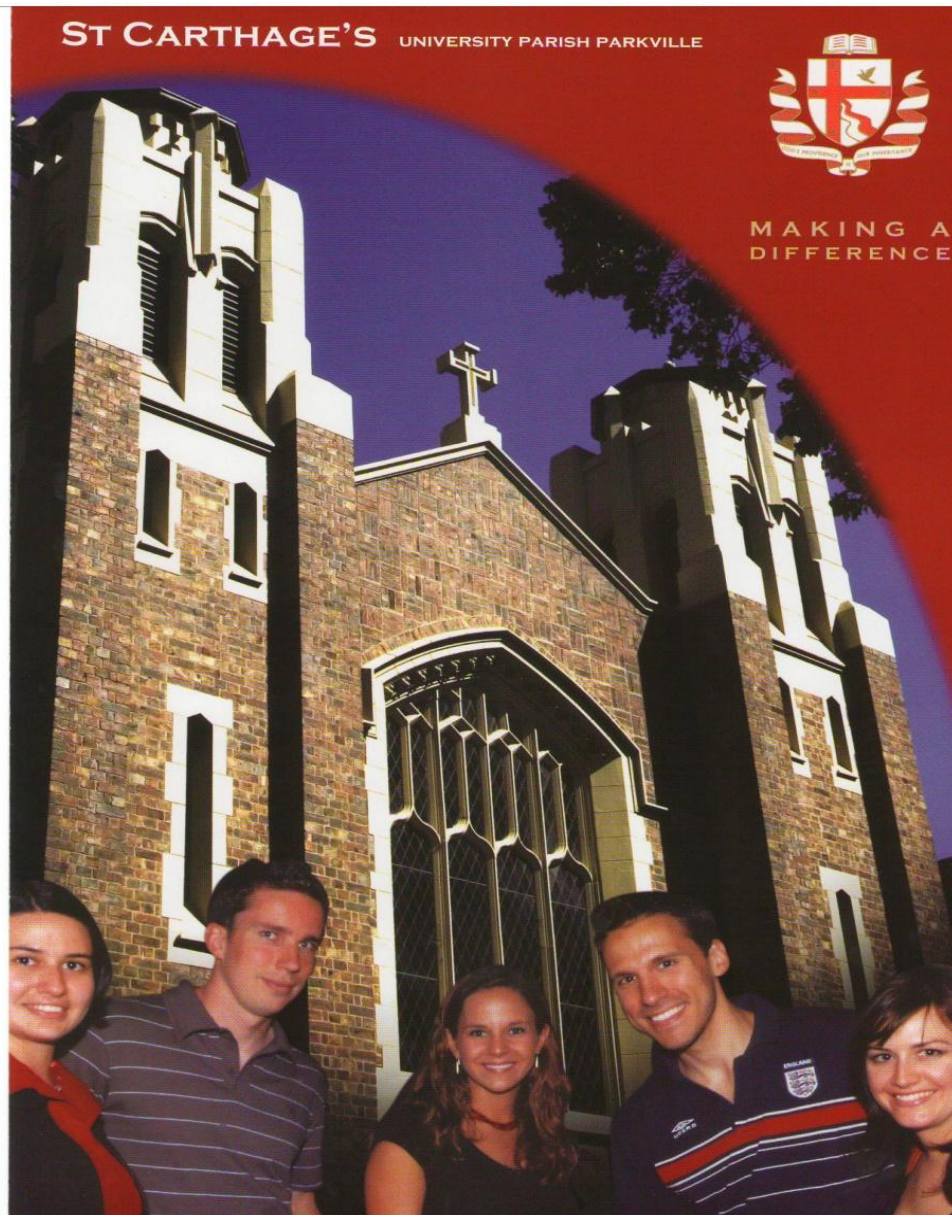

Recently we acquired a photo from Mr Peter Stafford of a Nuptial Mass at St Carthage's Church in 1953.

The photo reveals the original sanctuary design for the Latin Liturgy. Fr. Eric D'Arcy modernised the interior in the 1960's to facilitate the new English Liturgy.



In 1986 further adjustments were made to the sanctuary with the tabernacle and altar from The Convent of the Good Shepherd Sisters in Oakleigh.

In 2005 the baptismal font and the lectern were installed.

In more recent years the Heritage Pipe Organ was also installed.

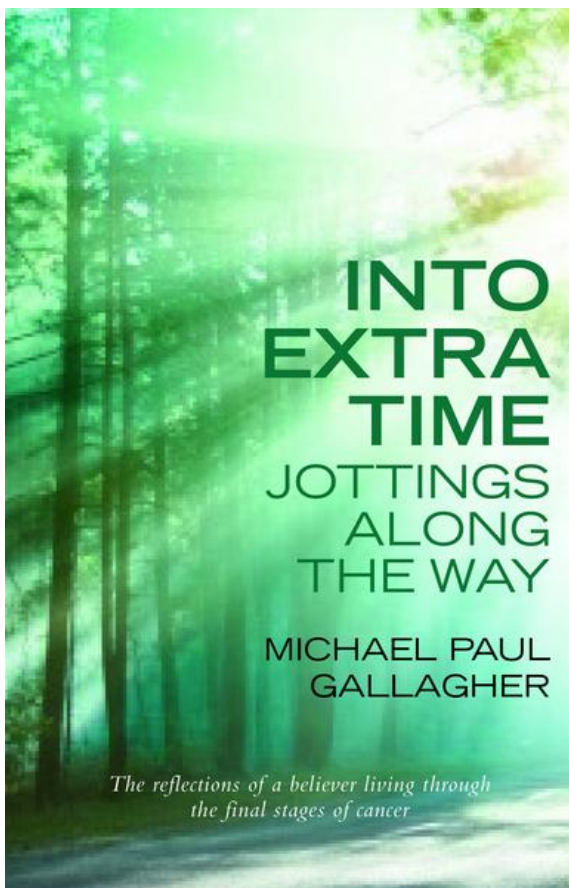

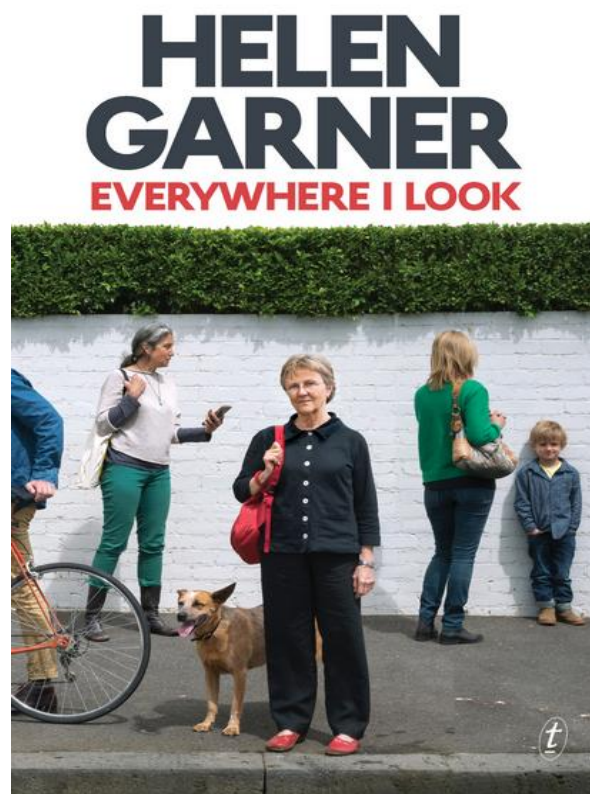
