





Enriching Our Country: South Sudanese?

Speakers: Tut Gordon Tut & Daniel Ajak

Tut was born in Ethiopia after his family left South Sudan due to civil war. After war broke out in Ethiopia, they had to move to Kenya for ten years till August 2002 when they came to Australia. He attended high school in Adelaide, and completed a Bachelor of Laws and Legal practice in 2015. Tut currently works as a lawyer at Victoria Legal Aid.

Daniel currently works as a criminal defence lawyer at Papa Hughes Lawyers. He was born in Ethiopia in 1991 after his parents also fled the 22 years civil war conflict in South Sudan. Immediately after his birth, his parents also fled to Kenya where they were in a refugee camp called Kakuma. After 13 years, Daniel and his 19 year old sister were sent by their parents to migrate to Australia for a better lifestyle. His sister, with the support of an uncle, raised him in Adelaide. At university he studied law and commerce graduating in 2015. He and Tut were admitted on the same day as solicitors and barristers in the Supreme Court of South Australia. "I love my work as a criminal defence lawyer and I get a buzz out of fighting for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged in our community. It makes me happy to directly give back to my South Sudanese community and other CALD groups at large."
