

END OF LIFE ISSUES

David W. Kissane

AC, MD. MPM, FRANZCP, FACHPM, FAPM

Professor David W. Kissane, AC, MD is an academic psychiatrist, psychooncology researcher and palliative care physician. He is currently the Head of Psychiatry for Monash University, previously the Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York and, before that, the Foundation Chair of Palliative Medicine at the University of Melbourne. Professor Kissane consults clinically at Cabrini Health and Monash Health.

His academic interests include individual, group, couples and family psychotherapy trials, communication skills training, and the ethics of end-of-life care. He is best known for his model of family therapy delivered to 'at risk' families during palliative care.




At MSKCC, Prof. Kissane established a Communication Skills Training and Research Laboratory, which trained over 1000 clinicians. He is the author of over 350 publications, including the Oxford Textbook of Communication in Oncology and Palliative Care, OUP 2017. Prof. Kissane has received many awards including the Klerman Award for Psychotherapy Research from Cornell University (2012). In 2018, Prof Kissane was made a Companion of the Order of Australia (AC) "for eminent service to psychiatry, particularly psychooncology and palliative medicine".

Cape Schanck

Saturday, 28 April 2018

Cape Schanck is the southernmost tip of the Mornington Peninsula and separates the wild ocean waters of Bass Strait from the slightly calmer waters of Western Port.

The Prayer Day Walk is in two loops. In the morning along the clifftops from the Cape Schanck carpark out to the unspoiled gem of Bushrangers Bay and return. In the afternoon, walk north to explore Fingal Beach and the rugged beauty of Bass Strait and return to the carpark. (approx 12km)

Easy walking on dirt paths. Steps down to the beaches. Exposed to Bass Strait so may be windy and cold.

This is an opportunity for you to spend some reflective time walking in silence within a faith community in Nature. It offers you the experience of listening to God speaking to you in Nature
