

Parish News

- ✚ Last Sunday was Chaplaincy Sunday and the annual collection was taken up for our presence in prisons, Juvenile Justice Centres, Public Hospitals around Melbourne, HIV Aids Support and Mission to Seafarers. Our parish contribution was \$504.40 this has been forwarded to the Archdiocesan Centre.
- ✚ The current Parish Project is to establish helpful access to renewed toilet facilities at the rear of our church. The plans include a wider well-lit path for wheelchair access, together with a renewed toilet block in the yard of the church. Plans are now before the City Council, and work will proceed as soon as trades people are able to be appointed after the usual planning procedures. The money is already raised and is available to be readily used as soon as the project is given the green light.
- ✚ Fr. Elligate will be taking annual leave from the Parish commencing Monday 18th June. A list of temporary support priests for Sunday Masses will be posted soon.





The requirements would be to offer a few hours per fortnight and attend our monthly meetings, where we discuss the individuals and families we have visited and those we are about to visit as well as sharing our feedback and experiences.

WRITING WOMEN BACK INTO THE CHURCH

Women are present throughout the Gospels. They were present at every key point of Jesus' life, even at the tomb.

Since the Royal Commission, there has been a greater recognition of the role that women must play in the Church, but they have always been on the front line, sometimes in conflict with priests and bishops. Can the model of service and leadership by these "troublesome" Catholic women offer a better vision of the Church? How can we write them back into our stories?

Fatima Measham, a consulting editor and regular columnist at *Eureka Street*, also hosts the *ChatterSquare* podcast, which focuses on social change. She writes extensively on identity, social justice and the environment, and has been published by *The Guardian*, *Meanjin* and *Right Now*. She also appears regularly at writers' festivals and on radio to speak about politics and culture.
