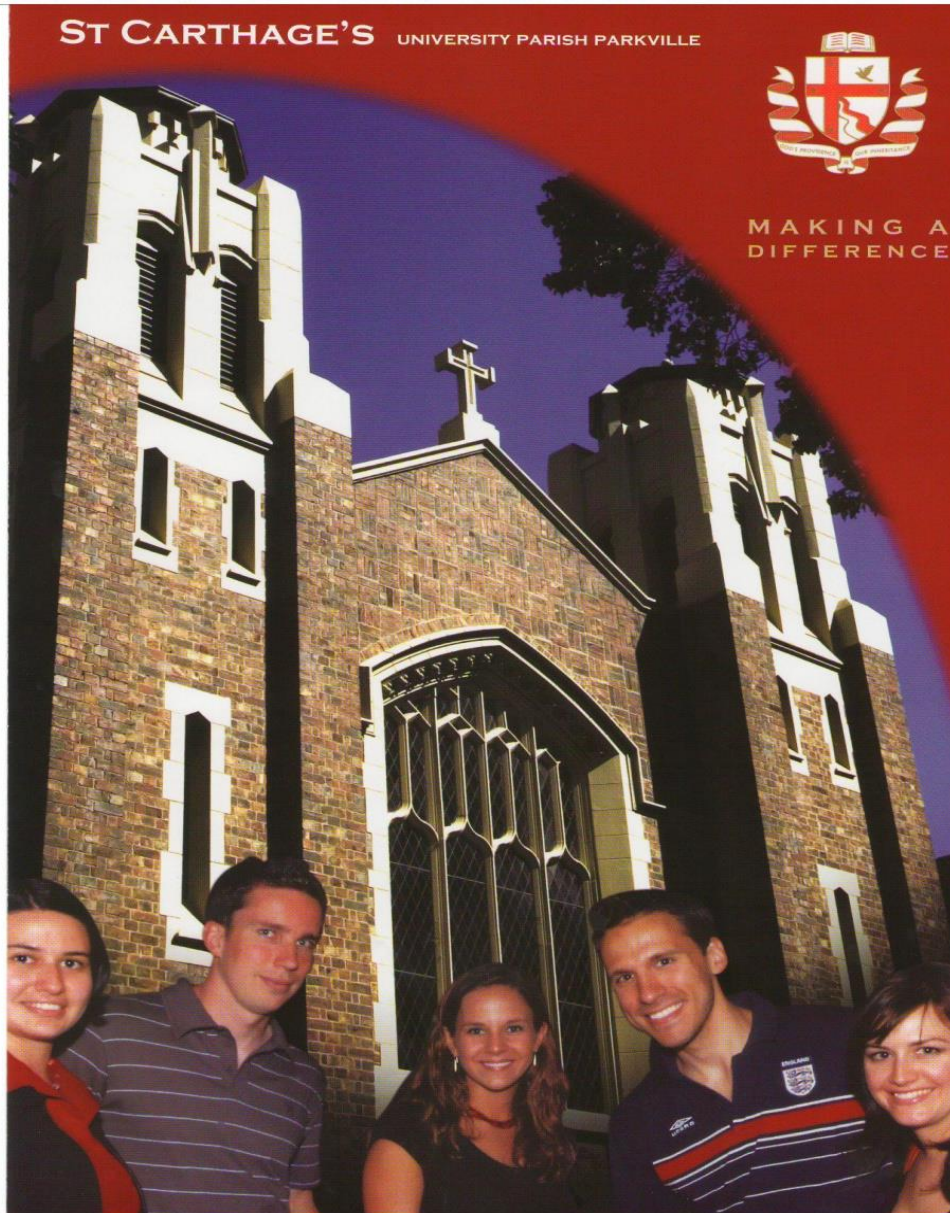

Aunty Pam Pedersen

Aunty Pam is a Yorta Yorta woman and daughter of Pastor Sir Douglas and Lady Nicholls who fought for the struggle of all Aboriginal people. Aunty Pam is employed by Berry Street Shepparton and Jesuit Social Services working with young people and their families who have come in contact with the criminal justice system. She is an Elder of the Victorian Aboriginal community, sitting on various Koorie Courts in Melbourne. Aunty Pam is also a keen sportsperson who has participated in the World Masters Games.



Dalal Smiley

Dalal is Chief Executive Officer of Wellsprings for Women, an organisation founded by the Presentation Sisters to empower migrant women in Dandenong, Casey and Cardinia. Dalal's experience migrating from Lebanon to Australia in 1976 has led her to work in migrant settlement and the language services sector. She founded the Victoria Arabic Social Services which she chaired from 1998 – 2005. Dalal was Victorian Multicultural Commissioner from 2001 – 2005 and has been awarded an honorary doctorate of laws.



John Ginnane (OX 2016)

John is currently at the University of Melbourne's Newman College studying for a Bachelor of Arts. While he was at Xavier College, John participated in the Ignatian Service Program and became passionate about social justice issues. Since graduating in 2016, John has continued his involvement in community activities with young people of migrant and refugee backgrounds from the Carlton Housing Commission and with young Aboriginal people from Bourke NSW.

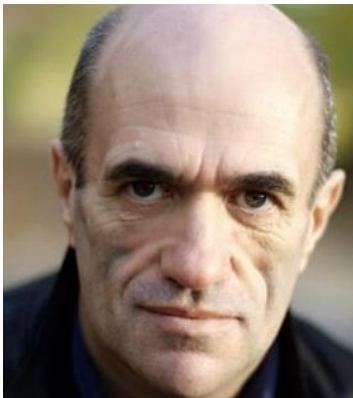

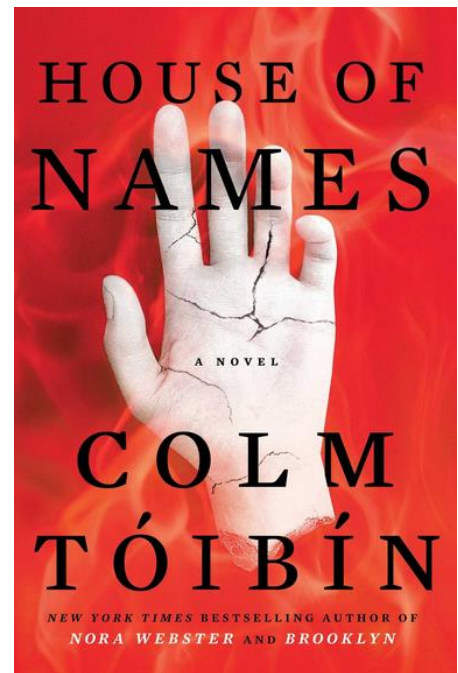

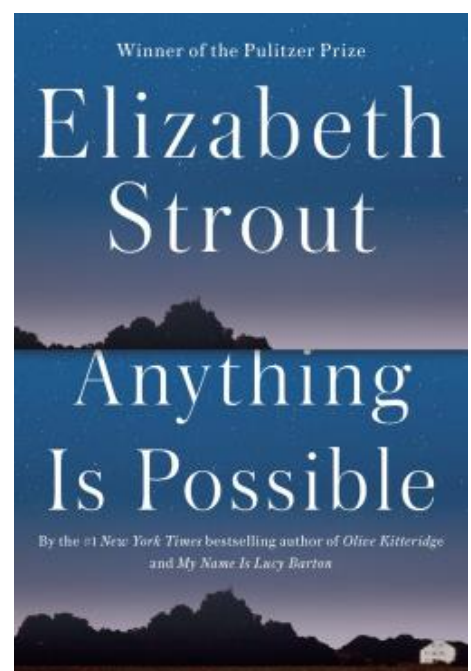

Is the central Power of the Papacy today with us to stay?

It is widely held that John Paul II was the most influential pope in church history, and a papal superstar. Today we are likely to assume that the Pope "owns" the church, lock, stock & barrel. But without a grip on history, we forget that in 1799 the papacy almost went right out of business with the death of Pius VI. This presentation will focus on what happened between these two Popes, how unbalanced the church has become in the next 218 years, and how we might recover some local autonomy.

Paul Collins, historian, broadcaster and writer, was a priest for 33 years, until he resigned his ministry in 2001 after a dispute with the Vatican over his 1997 book "Papal Power". In his latest book *Absolute Power- how the Pope became the most influential man in the world*, released earlier this year, he adds further reflection after the experience of two more Popes. A former head of the religion and ethics department of the ABC and author of fifteen books, he is a well-known commentator on Catholicism and the papacy, with a strong interest also in ethics, the environment and population issues.
