





Is the central Power of the Papacy today with us to stay?

It is widely held that John Paul II was the most influential pope in church history, and a papal superstar. Today we are likely to assume that the Pope "owns" the church, lock, stock & barrel. But without a grip on history, we forget that in 1799 the papacy almost went right out of business with the death of Pius VI. This presentation will focus on what happened between these two Popes, how unbalanced the church has become in the next 218 years, and how we might recover some local autonomy.

Paul Collins, historian, broadcaster and writer, was a priest for 33 years, until he resigned his ministry in 2001 after a dispute with the Vatican over his 1997 book "Papal Power". In his latest book Absolute Power- how the Pope became the most influential man in the world, released earlier this year, he adds further reflection after the experience of two more Popes. A former head of the religion and ethics department of the ABC and author of fifteen books, he is a well-known commentator on Catholicism and the papacy, with a strong interest also in ethics, the environment and population issues.

An invitation to help frame submissions for the 2020 Plenary Council

PlenaryCouncil 2020

The Bishops are organising a Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia in 2020. Itis the first National Council in over 80 years. They have invited Catholics to make one or more submissions as individuals or as a group. Jan and Richard Curtain are keen to set up a group at St Carthage's to work out submissions as a parish. Jan is an active national consumer health advocate. Richard has been a public policy consultant and is now a researcher at ANU. Here is their outline of how they propose to organise a parish response to the call of Plenary Council organisers to 'have your say'.

Frank Brennan SJ, in his talk at St Carthages recently, challenged us to start the change process at the parish level. We noticed on a recent stay in Canberra that the Canberra Archdiocese was well advanced with its completed and planned listening and dialogue sessions. The response in Melbourne has been notably slower to get off the ground. The first preparatory stage for the Plenary Council continues until Ash Wednesday 2019.

We want to work with others to identify major issues of concern to the future of the Catholic Church in Australia and to formulate carefully considered responses. The idea is to work together with a group of anywhere between 6 and up to 30 people. If more than 30 are interested, we can form a separate group.

Once a draft has been prepared and agreed within the group, it can then be circulated by email to a wider group who are interested in commenting on and endorsing the submission. The final step is to lodge the submissions no later than before Christmas.

Introducing Jane Kelly ibvm

Jane Kelly was born and raised in Melbourne, graduating from the University and later completing post-graduate studies at Monash. As a Loreto sister she taught in Loreto Toorak first of all and then, briefly, at Normanhurst. She was appointed Principal of Loreto Toorak after which time she undertook studies in Theology at Heythrop College in London. Returning to Australia she was appointed Head of St Mary's College, arriving in November 1980 and completing her term of office in January 1997.

She is at present involved in researching the lives of the first Loreto sisters to have come to Australia, with a view to publication. Her research into the handwritten letters of these women has taken her to various parts of the world, tracing the trajectory of their correspondence. She has been invited to attend academic conferences and present papers on her findings in the US, England and in Ireland. She also responds from time to time and on request, to offer presentations here, in Australia.
