# The roster will commence in February




- We need 3 counters to count the collection money after the 5pm Sunday Mass.

# What undergraduate units can I study at CTC in 2019?







Begin your study at CTC in 2019 with foundational units such as:

#### CTII00C

## Introducing Catholic Theology

This unit introduces learners to the context, purpose, methods and content of theology in the Catholic tradition. It examines theose elements that together constitute a balanced and comprehensive engagement in the search for a deeper understanding of the Christian faith. The Second Vatican Council's understanding of revelation, faith, scripture, tradition and the teaching office of the church will be examined and applied to the church's mission in Australia's multi-religious and non-religious context.

#### BS1001C

#### The Biblical World: Texts and Traditions

As an introduction to the world and literature of the Bible, this unit offers an overview of the historical, cultural, social and literary contexts of the literature of the Old and New Testaments. Students will be introduced to topics such as the history of Israel, religion, cult and temple, the Torah, prophesy and wisdom, Gospel and church, and the Jewish and Greco-Roman worlds of the New Testament. The unit will also examine thematic and theological links between the testaments. Topics will be illustrated by specific texts taken from both testaments.

#### DS1001C

### Christian Spirituality: Patristic and Medieval Authors

This unit introduces students to the study of Christian spirituality with some significant examples of Christian literature from the beginning of the Christian movement to the Middle Ages. The focus will be on the study of significant texts in their theological and cultural setting. Students will be required to consider how this relates to the study and living of Christian spirituality today, and to experience some contemporary expressions of aspects of this subject. Examples of texts include: The Letters of Ignatius of Antioch; Athanasius, The Life of Antony; Eastern liturgy and iconography; Gregory of Nyssa, The Life of Mases; Benedict of Nursia, The Holy Rule; selections from Bernard of Clairvaux and Hildegard of Bingen; and selections from medieval women writers, the Rhineland mystics and the English mystical tradition.

Studying theology at CTC is an opportunity to deepen your understanding of your faith and engage in rich theological discussion.
