

Step 2 in Parish Submission to the Plenary Council 2020

St Carthages parish has joined with 34 other parishes to put out an agreed statement based on key issues identified from parish submissions to the plenary Council in 2020. On Saturday 13 April, 60 people met at the Catholic Theological College, East Melbourne. Richard and Jan Curtain, representing St Carthages, worked with four other parishes from Templestowe, Kilmore, Cheltenham, and Grovedale & Torquay to organise the meeting.

Peter Sheehan, from St Kevin's Templestowe, analysed and presented the key themes from 15 parish and 7 individual submissions to the Plenary Council. The meeting over two hours discussed the value of putting out a common statement, what was missing from the key issues identified, and individually rated the key issues. The meeting agreed that putting out a joint statement was worthwhile, as the submission process for the Plenary Council does not allow for a collective input from a diocese. A drafting group has been formed.

The next steps are to complete the analysis of the key issues identified from the meeting and the parish submissions and to prepare a draft statement by 30 April. This will then be sent to each participating parish to discuss and seek endorsement through a parish meeting between 1 and 13 May. The statement will then be finalised and sent by 15 May to the Plenary Council Secretariat and the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

St Carthages plans to hold a meeting on Thursday 9 May at the parish centre to discuss and endorse the draft statement. Please contact Richard or Jan Curtain if you are interested in coming to the meeting:

### **VOICES FROM YOUTH**

## What do young people think of the Church – in the present and for the future?

There are many groups of older Catholics agitating for reform, and having done so from well before the clerical abuse scandal came under wide scrutiny. Many of those are frustrated or disillusioned by Vatican II reforms showing great promise but failing to materialize, or being actively unwound.

But how do those in current generations see things, those whose life experience came after both Vatican II and the rise of reactionary forces? Do they see themselves as welcome and having their place in the Church? Are their concerns different from those of older people, or is there more overlap than meets the eye?

We will hear from four young Melbourne Catholics. Two of them are young womenone is a student living in a university college, the other has finished her university course and is now beginning teaching. The other two are young men already entering on their different forms of contribution to the Church; one is a Brother with the Blessed Sacrament order, the other is in service at St Patrick's Cathedral.

Pass the word to other young people, and bring some with you to hear the views and aspirations of these four people: listen, and enter into dialogue with them!


