

## **VOICES FROM YOUTH**

#### What do young people think of the Church – in the present and for the future?

There are many groups of older Catholics agitating for reform, and having done so from well before the clerical abuse scandal came under wide scrutiny. Many of those are frustrated or disillusioned by Vatican II reforms showing great promise but failing to materialize, or being actively unwound.

But how do those in current generations see things, those whose life experience came after both Vatican II and the rise of reactionary forces? Do they see themselves as welcome and having their place in the Church? Are their concerns different from those of older people, or is there more overlap than meets the eye?

We will hear from four young Melbourne Catholics. Two of them are young womenone is a student living in a university college, the other has finished her university course and is now beginning teaching. The other two are young men already entering on their different forms of contribution to the Church; one is a Brother with the Blessed Sacrament order, the other is in service at St Patrick's Cathedral.

Pass the word to other young people, and bring some with you to hear the views and aspirations of these four people: listen, and enter into dialogue with them!






