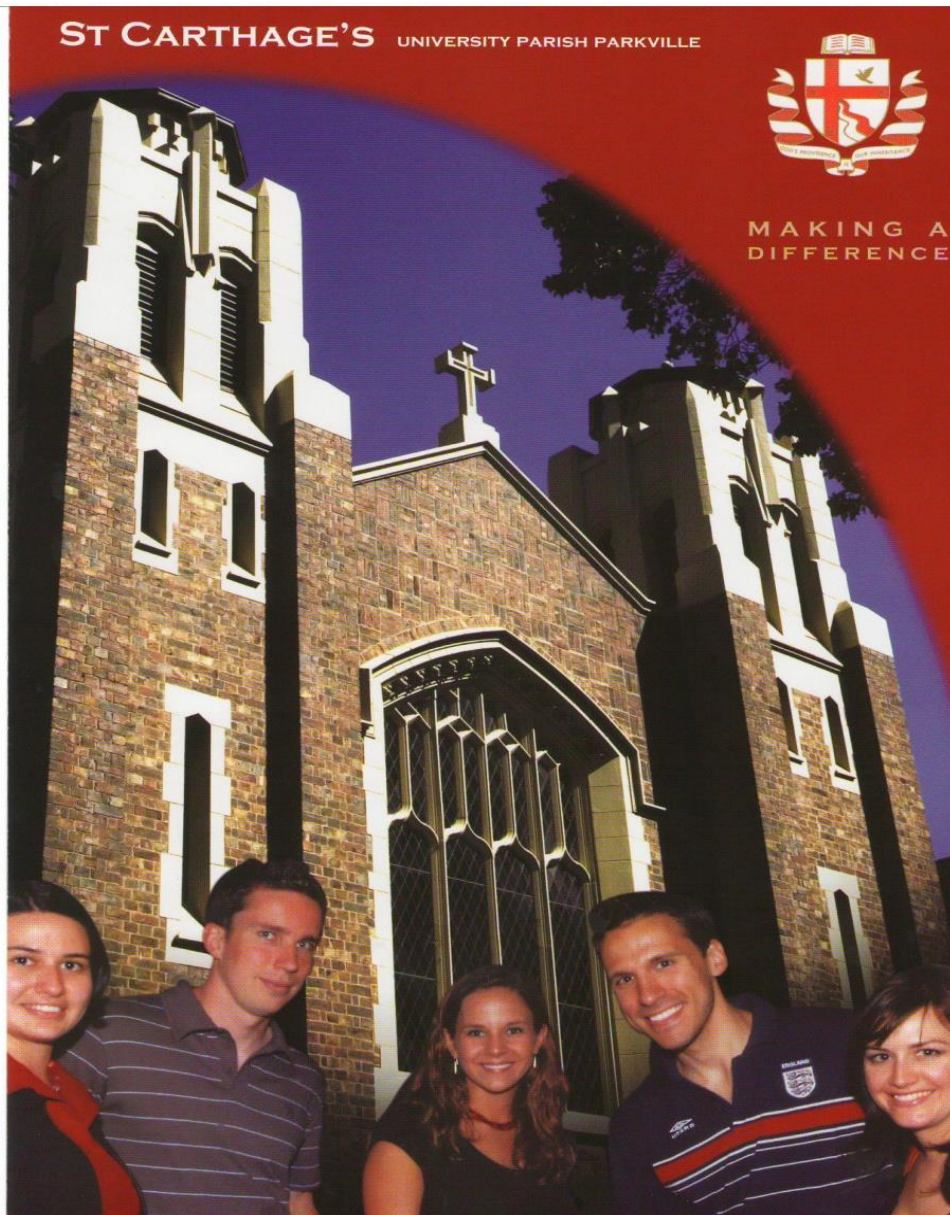

**Women in the Contemporary Church
- Opportunity or Scandal?**

The Royal Commission on institutional sexual abuse recommended a number of changes in the Church, including a greater place for lay people- especially women – in its decision-making and elsewhere. But many Church members have been agitating for this for a long time, and women have been prominent among them.

Four committed women will present from a variety of personal backgrounds – thereby providing samples of the range of talents and life experiences that women could bring to enhance the ability of the Church to carry out its mission.

Margaret Rush: Wife, grandmother, a pioneer in the profession of occupational therapy, will reflect on “Jesus in his time”.

Eleanor Flynn: Her academic background is in Medicine and Theology, with interests in education and women’s place in the world. She will reflect on Vatican II emphasis on the place of all the baptised in the Church and the prevailing aspirations and achievements of women in the world at large.

Sue Phillips : A Franciscan Missionary of Mary, worked in Morocco for 9 years, lived in Rome for 12 years, former international leader of her congregation. She will present some “Anecdotes from Rome”.

Gail Grossman Freyne: Lawyer, family therapist and mediator. She will reflect on the scandal of women’s exclusion from official ministry and the opportunity to remedy this, including the cardinalate and the Pope’s Commission on the diaconate.

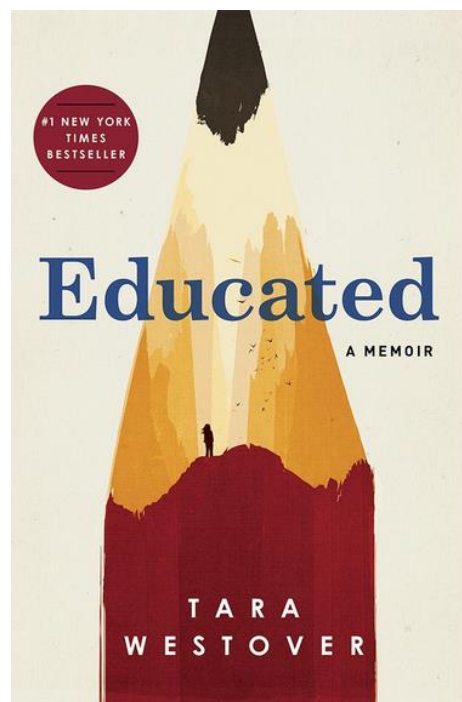

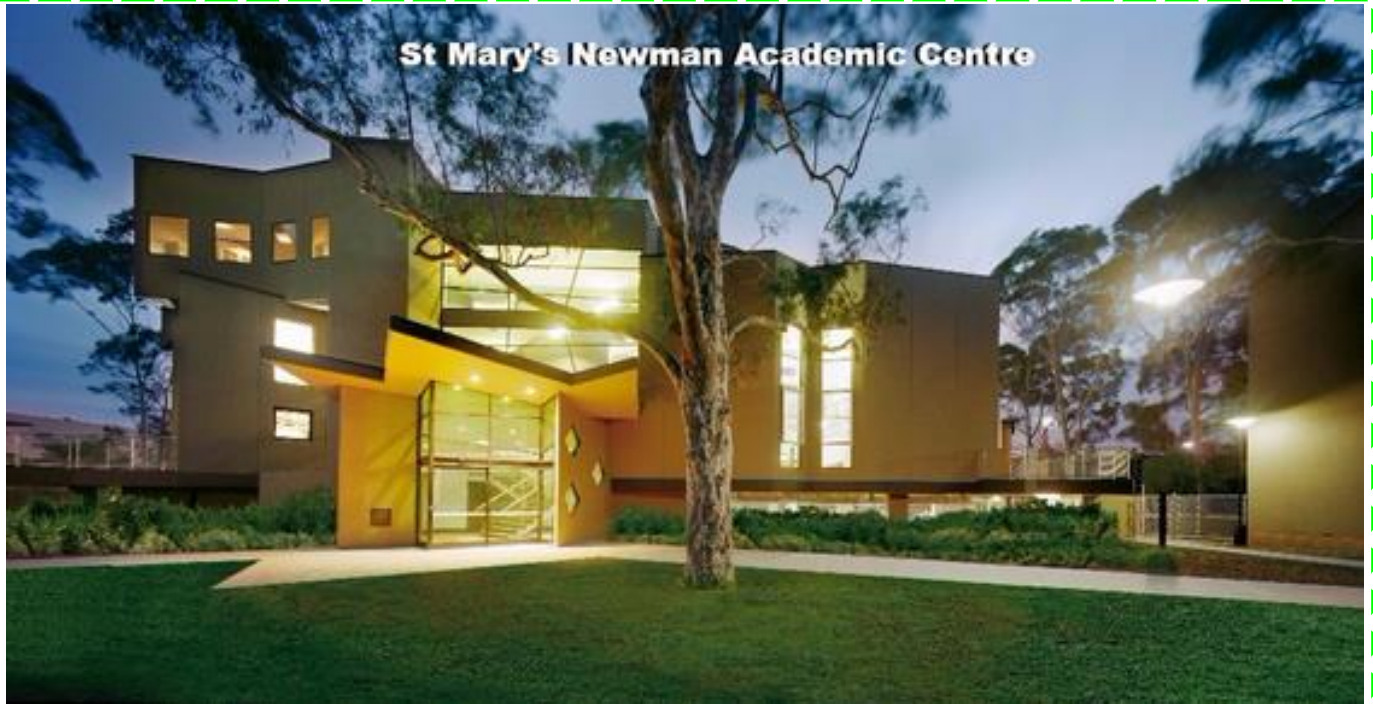
Religion, Morality and the State: homosexuality and Catholic Britain 1954-1971

Please find below details of an upcoming Cardinal Newman Lecture that you may find of interest.

Two Cardinals: Conflict and Controversy in the Victorian Catholic Church.

Professor Jeffrey von Arx, SJ, Thomas I Gasson Visiting Professor at Boston College, will deliver the annual Cardinal Newman Lecture on Thursday, May 23rd at 5.00 p.m. in the Oratory, Newman College. The free public lecture will explore the tensions between Cardinal John Henry Newman and Cardinal Henry Edward Manning in the second half of the Nineteenth Century.

Professor von Arx is a graduate of Princeton and Yale Universities and the Weston School of Theology. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1969 and was ordained in 1981. He was Dean of Fordham College, Chair of the History Department at Georgetown University and founding director of its Centre for Australian and New Zealand Studies. He is the author of: PROGRESS AND PESSIMISM: RELIGION, POLITICS AND HISTORY IN LATE NINETEENTH CENTURY BRITAIN (Harvard UP), VARIETIES OF ULTRAMONTANISM (Catholic UP) and many articles on late 19th century British history. From 2004 to 2016 he was President and Professor of History at Fairfield University, and is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.
