Geraldine Doogue AO is a renowned Australian journalist and broadcaster, including being at the helm of the ABC's prestigious program *Compass* for 20 years. In 2003, she was recognised with an Officer in the Order of Australia for services to the community and media. Geraldine often writes thoughtful and challenging articles calling all Catholics to examine how to live out our faith in an increasingly secular world.

Most recently, Francis Sullivan was the straight-talking CEO of The Truth, Justice and Healing Council, established to coordinate the Catholic Church's response to the Royal Commission, help develop the Church's reform.
