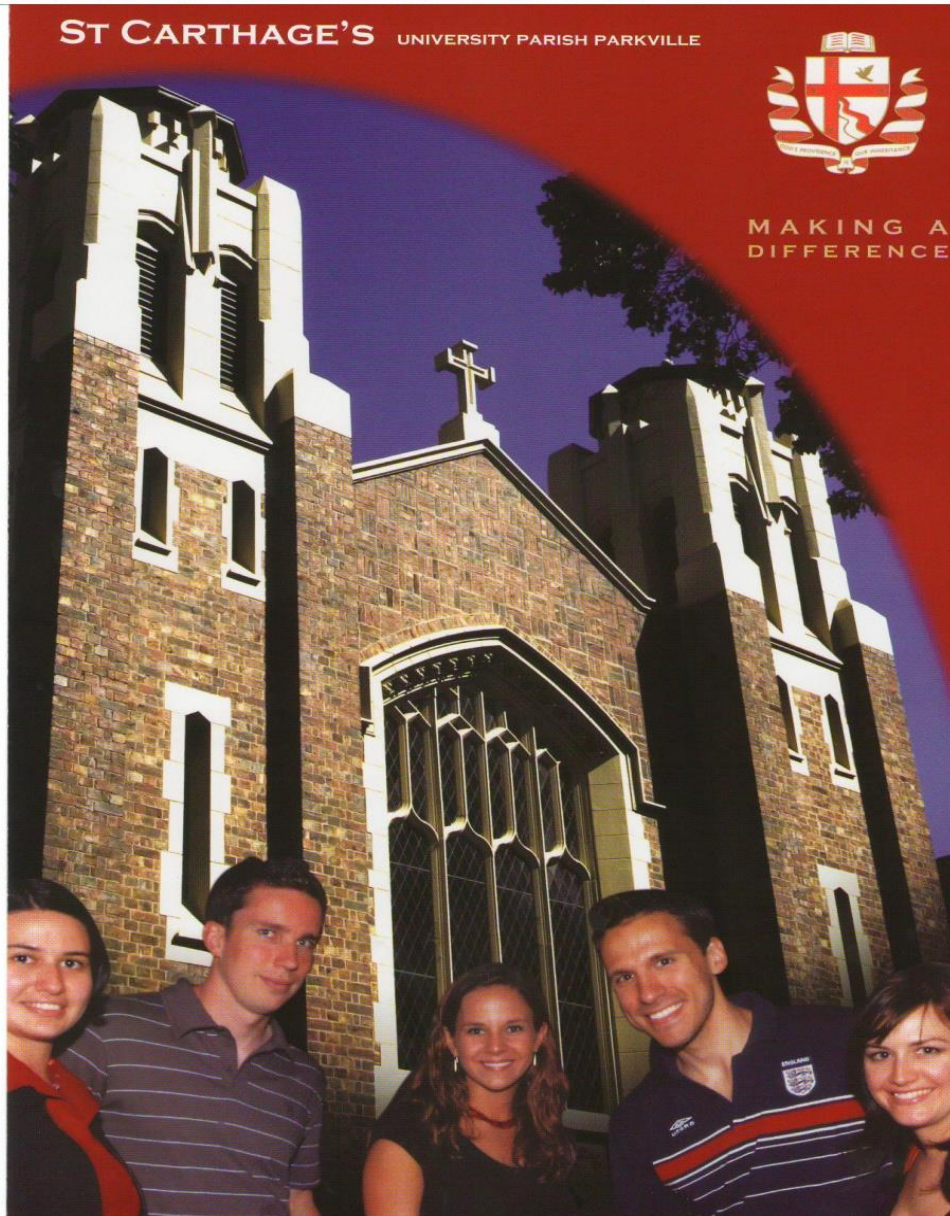

Current Report

Plenary Council of The Australian Catholic

The Plenary Council 2020 has moved into its next preparation phase with an announcement of six national themes for discernment that emerged from a historic process of listening to the voices of more than 222,000 people.

The six themes inviting people to reflect, to pray and to consider how God is calling the People of God to be a Christ-centred Church in Australia are:

- ✚ Missionary and Evangelising
- ✚ Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal
- ✚ Prayerful and Eucharistic
- ✚ Humble, Healing and Merciful
- ✚ A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community
- ✚ Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform.

Those reflections and conclusions would be supplemented by a period of several months, beginning in August, when people across the country would again be asked to engage locally with the plenary council process. “his discernment process will involve establishing working groups for each national theme for discernment,” People in faith communities across Australia will also be called to participate locally in their own communal Listening and Discernment encounters.

“The fruits of what is discerned during this time will shape the agenda for the first session of plenary council in October 2020”



Vote on the Parish Council Constitution on Saturday 20 and Sunday 21 July 2019 masses

Copies will be available from the porch of the Church. Rule 11 of the Constitution requires that parishioners receive 21 days' notice of a meeting to adopt the Constitution. We therefore notify you that at each of the three masses on Saturday 20 and Sunday 21 July a member of the Parish Council will attend and conduct a vote by show of hands on the following resolutions:

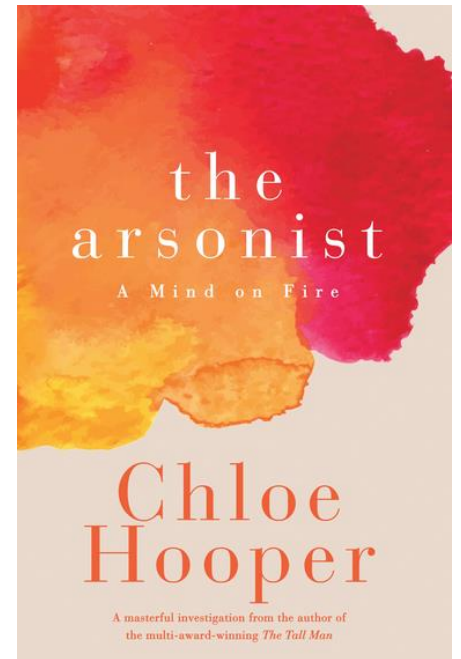

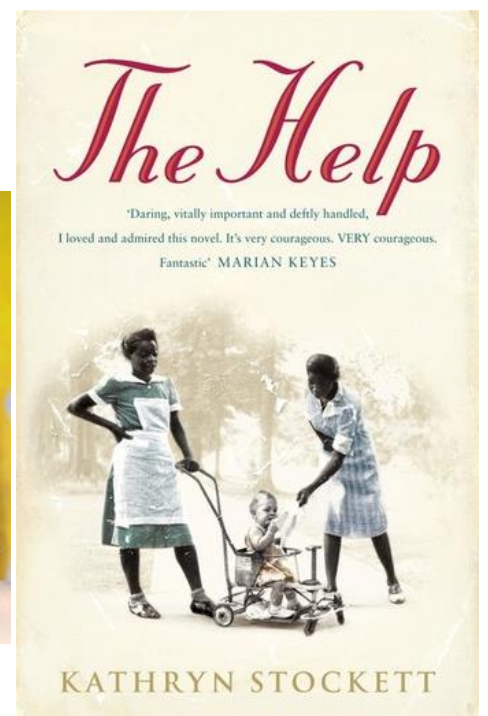

Also, a contestant in Australia's 2015 The X Factor and his recorded with artists such as Guy Sebastian, Ira Losco, Gary Pinto, Natasha Pinto and several other renowned artists, and has shared the stage with the likes of Matt Maher, Hillsong United and Darlene Zschech. After being selected to sing and write the English version of the official 2019 World Youth Day song 'Here I Am, The Servant of The Lord' Fr Rob performed in front of an audience of 1.4 Million people, including Pope Francis, in Panama in January 2019.
