

Her PhD in education was on the teaching of virtues, values and ethics. She will put forward not merely the facts of clericalism but also practical approaches for countering it, knowing full well that simply confronting it head on will not do the job.





Stage One of the journey to Plenary Council 2020 involved the collection of submissions from individual Australians and groups following a process of listening and dialogue as they explored how they might answer the main question: What do you think God is asking of us in Australia? More than 222,000 people participated in the process. What did people talk about? What issues were discussed? How we hold and proclaim a sensible and joyous religious faith, and confidently impart it to our friends and neighbours, even in the face of serious, secular opposition, will be the focus of this free public lecture.

Richard Leonard is a Jesuit priest. He has degrees in arts and education, as well as a Master's degree in theology. Fr Richard did graduate studies at the London Film School and has a PhD from the University of Melbourne. He directs the Australian Catholic Office for Film & Broadcasting, is an Honorary Fellow of the Australian Catholic University, has been a visiting scholar within the School of Theatre, Film & Television at UCLA and a Visiting Professor at the Pontifical Gregorian



University in Rome. He has been published in America Magazine, Eureka Street, US Catholics and is a regular columnist with The London Tablet and a regular guest on ABC Radio. His most recent book: Hatch, Match & Dispatch: A Catholic Guide to Sacraments, has just been released.


