

## Healthy Financial Matters at St Carthage's

♣ Next weekend a full report will be given on the proceedings of our recent Parish Financial Committee Meeting. In recent days Bernard Negline has submitted an independent audited report on Parish Finances for the last financial quarter.

The report notes that the income in the first half of the year from our Planned Giving Programme was \$9,852 above budget.

Renewed thanks to our generous contributors.

- The final costs on our paths and toilet amenity block were \$117,353.72.
  - The loan taken out through the Diocesan Development fund has not required the full \$100,000 allocation. This is due to earlier payments being taken from the Parish Church Account where some funds had already been set aside for this project.
- ♣ Each year each parish in the Archdiocese is given a quota to be paid quarterly into Diocesan funds. The quota is based on parish income and expenditure for the previous year. This year St Carthage's has been allocated a quota of \$8,862.


#### Geraldine Doogue AO

These days going out to the world as a Christian and a Catholic is not for the faint-hearted. Many people think we are nuts for believing in the Father, Son and Spirit. How we hold and proclaim a sensible and joyous religious faith, and confidently impart it to our friends and neighbours, even in the face of serious, secular opposition, will be the focus of this free public lecture.

Richard Leonard is a Jesuit priest. He has degrees in arts and education, as well as a Master's degree in theology. Fr Richard did graduate studies at the London Film School and has a PhD from the University of Melbourne. He directs the Australian Catholic Office for Film & Broadcasting, is an Honorary Fellow of the Australian Catholic University, has been a visiting scholar within the School of Theatre, Film & Television at UCLA and a Visiting Professor at the Pontifical Gregorian



University in Rome. He has been published in America Magazine, Eureka Street, US Catholics and is a regular columnist with The London Tablet and a regular guest on ABC Radio. His most recent book: Hatch, Match & Dispatch: A Catholic Guide to Sacraments, has just been released.
