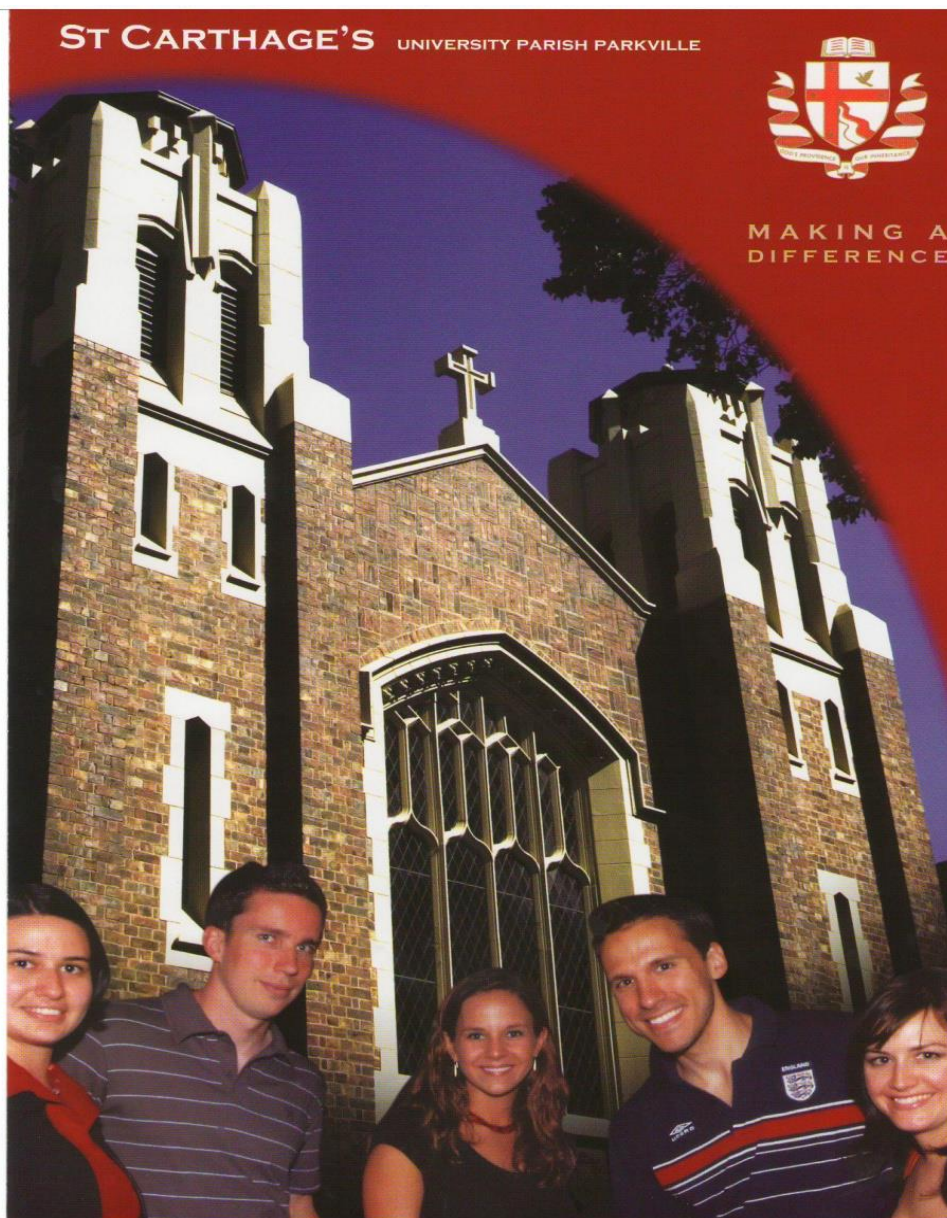

## Invitation to join stage 2 of discussion groups for Australian Plenary Council

The second stage of the Plenary Council is called communal discernment. This involves small groups meeting to discuss and make recommendations directed at national and local levels. The topics for discussion are based on the six themes identified from stage one - see the Plenary Council 2020 website for details of these themes.

Each discernment session is expected to result in a response that can be summarised in 150 words or so. A number of national Writing and Discernment Groups will then meet to discuss these responses. These groups are to prepare thematic papers to be used to work out the agenda for the first session of the Plenary Council in October 2020. Stage 2 is to be completed by the first few months of 2020.

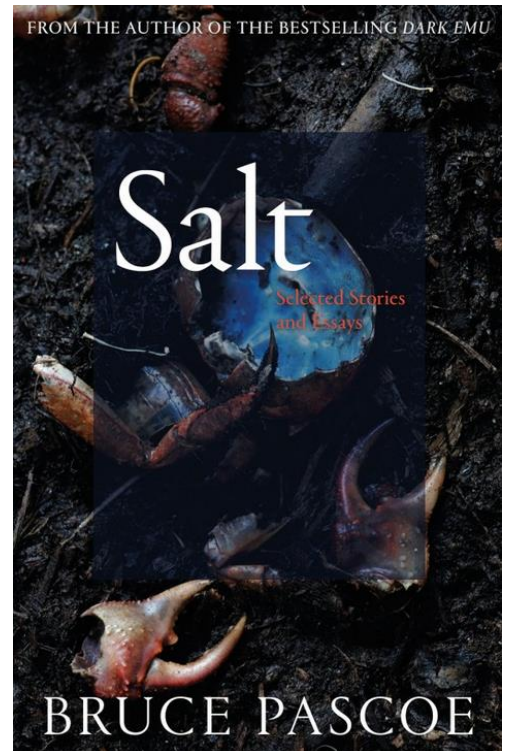
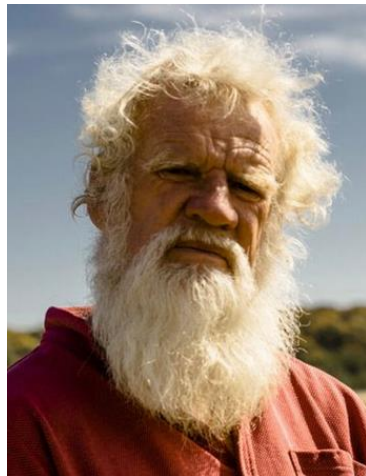

## **Pluralism and Peace**

### **The Religions in Global Civil Society**

"The real war is the battle of ideas". This headline goes to the heart of the religiously fuelled violence which is afflicting many countries, just as important democracies are threatened by rising nationalist movements and populism. How can the world religions work together to oppose the misuse of religion to justify violence?

John D'Arcy May has drawn on half a century of debate and dialogue about how world religions can help maintain human rights, overcome economic inequality and prevent ecological destruction. As he details in his new book, *Pluralism & Peace: The Religions in Global Civil Society*, May explores how in the Asia-Pacific region, the 'great' traditions of Buddhism, Christianity and Islam, along with the various religious traditions in the Pacific Islands – including Australia – can forge societies of mutual respect and tolerance to advance the wellbeing of everyone.

Born in Melbourne, Dr John D'Arcy May has a distinguished academic career, teaching at the Catholic Ecumenical Institute, University of Münster, and as Ecumenical Research Officer with the Melanesian Council of Churches in PNG, after which he became Director of the Irish School of Ecumenics, Trinity College, Dublin, where he was Associate Professor of Interfaith Dialogue.
