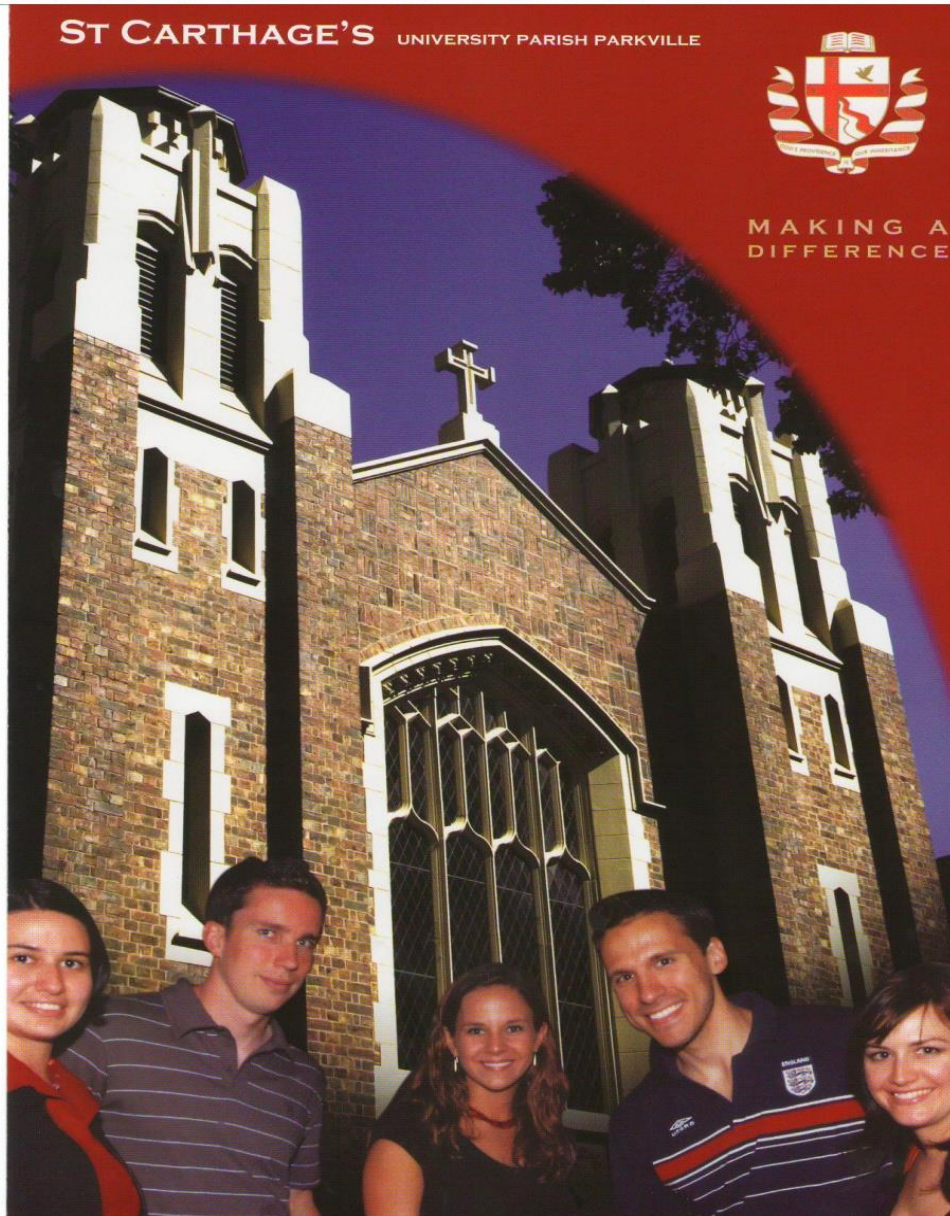

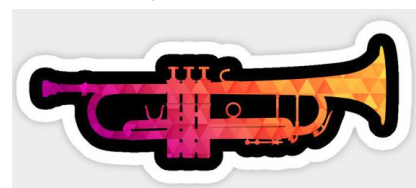

  *Douglas Lawrence will play our heritage pipe organ at the 6pm Vigil Mass.*



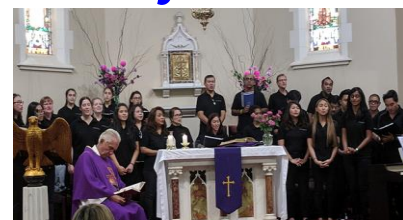
This Sunday Evening 16th February:

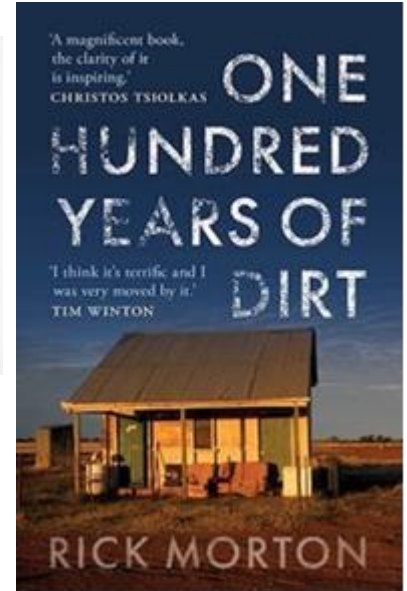

Human Research Ethics Committees

Expressions of Interest: Membership category: lay person

The University of Melbourne is seeking additional lay people for its Human Research Ethics Committees. The role of the ethics committees is to promote ethical human research, to protect the welfare of research participants and to foster research that benefits the community.

A layperson is someone who has 'no affiliation with the institution and does not currently engage in medical, scientific, legal or academic work;' 5.1.30(b) *National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research 2007(updated 2018)*. Applicants should have an interest in and commitment to human research and an understanding of the principles underpinning ethical research. Information on the University of Melbourne human research ethics committees and review processes can be found here.

Time commitment

Members are typically required to attend 11 monthly meetings throughout the year for which several hours preparation (reading and reviewing research applications) is required. Meetings are collegial and their function is to bring together all members' views on the ethical implications of each research proposal. In addition, members may sometimes be required to review applications outside of meetings. Meeting duration is 2 – 3 hours. Training will be provided.

Terms of Appointment

The appointment is for an initial period of twelve months. Members are eligible for reappointment. Members will receive an honorarium for their time. To be eligible for appointment you must also not be currently involved with the University of Melbourne or engaged in medical, scientific, legal or academic work.

Expression of Interest

To apply please provide a letter describing what you believe you can bring to the ethics committee, a short *curriculum vitae* or summary of education and work experience and details of two referees who can be contacted by telephone.

Parish Finance Committee Report

We welcome David Menzies and Michael Pirotta as new members on the Committee.

The budget for the year is still being prepared with the assistance of our auditor Bernard Negline.

At the moment we have focused on our working budget for the year together with our paths and toilet complex cost.

This project is now completed and in operation. The total project since inauguration in 2018 has cost the parish \$127,330. After taking out a loan from the Archdiocese we have reduced the loan to \$55,281. While this is a capital asset we will focus on meeting this loan repayment as soon as possible.

We plan a financial recognition weekend on 14th and 15th March.

The current level of our Parish working balance account is \$23,000”
