Inversation Series a

Fr. Michael outlined more recent research into the person of Jesus and what may have been his mind about what shape his community of believers would be after he had gone.

Remember this was a time when many devout Jewish people believed the end of time was coming soon.

It is highly likely that his own thinking about a community following his time would be very provisional until the end of time occurred.

The early faith communities, called Churches or Assembly of Believers were there waiting for the immanent return of Jesus in power.

This would bring all life and time together.

This is named as the Parousia or return in power of the risen Lord.

The letters of Paul indicate that the realization of the return of the Lord would take sometime and therefore there had to be strategies for a long haul.

It was in this period that the diverse Churches or local faith communities had to work out a structure, who would preside and what would be our Pastoral Strategies until the Lord comes.
