Safeguarding Sunday

Safeguarding Sunday (formerly Child Protection Sunday) in the Catholic Church will be held this year on Sunday 12 September

This day seeks to acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children, including by priests, religious and lay people within Catholic contexts. It makes a commitment to practices and protocols that create and maintain safe environments for all people, especially children and other people who are at risk. It invites people to pray for those harmed by abuse directly and indirectly.

The Catholic Church in Australia will mark Safeguarding Sunday on September 12 this year, just after the conclusion of National Child Protection Week. While this event was previously known as Child Protection Sunday, the new name of Safeguarding Sunday reflects the Church's focus on the protection and support of all people, especially children and adults at risk. A series of resources have been developed by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference to commemorate this important day. These resources can be found on the <u>Bishops Conference</u> website.
