



# **Parish Discussion Group**



14 November 2021 "The poor you will always have with you" (Mk 14:7)

The poor are to be embraced, not counted. "The poor you will always have with you" (*Mk* 14:7). Jesus spoke these words at a meal in Bethany, in the home of a certain Simon, known as the leper, a few days before Passover. As the Evangelist recounts, a woman came in with an alabaster flask full of precious ointment and poured it over Jesus' head. 



