Christ will appear again to bring salvation.

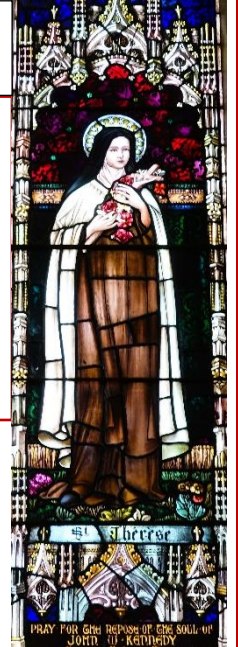

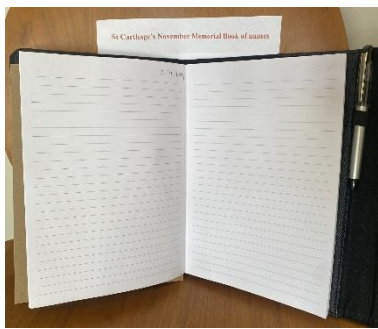
PRAY & PAINT
