The Pastoral Council, through its future planning group, has worked hard to identify what needs to be done to implement the recent parish survey. Mindful of our stated St Carthage values - that we aim to be an honest, warm, accepting and compassionate faith community where all are welcome, where all experience sustained adult faith, pastoral support and engagement with social justice, and that we are committed to transparency, accountability, consultation and the participation of lay men and women in every aspect, the Group has divided necessary work into functional groups:

- 1. Liturgy and Music;
- 2. Outreach (communications, inclusivity, social justice, synodality and pastoral care;
- 3. Sustaining the parish (finance, maintenance, administration); and
- **4.** Education (adult faith, existing groups, sacramental program).

Immediate practical actions are proposed for each area, with a further list of things to be done as we move forward. These proposals will be outlined and discussed at the Parish Forum next Sunday, with lunch to follow, in the parish house, 30 Bayles St, Parkville. All Welcome!

The official collection for the <u>Archbishop's Campaign</u> this month is **23-24 August**. "The generosity of your parish will fund vital ministries and key projects of the Church in




