- Obtain or update your Working with Children Check: <u>Working with Children Check | vic.gov.au</u> (Please note: renewable anytime 6 months before expiry. Any checks over 3 months expired requires a new application)
- Obtain or update your police check if required: <u>Criminal History Record Check (Police Record Check)</u>
  (Renewed every 3 years. For new applicants, the parish can provide a discount code for volunteers, and is happy to the remainder)
- Read then sign the Code of Conduct: <a href="https://camorgau.Safeguarding/ProceduresCodeConduct">https://camorgau.Safeguarding/ProceduresCodeConduct</a>.
