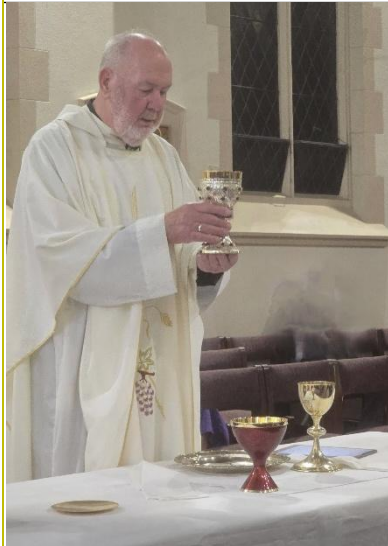

Jesus greets disciples on the road to Emmaus.



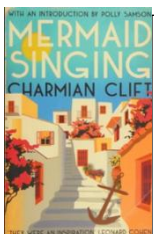
